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BEAUJOLAIS, AN **EXCEPTIONAL** REGION

Beaujolais welcomes anyone who loves nature, heritage and wine. The Beaujolais region, just a few kilometres from Lyon, has vast natural spaces and has been classified as a UNESCO "Global Geopark" since 2018. The diversity of its land is remarkable. This richness of soils is particularly evident in its world-famous vineyards.

From the crazy extravagance of Beaujolais Nouveaux to the subtle wines with character and ageing potential, the best way to taste and discover the region is along

the Beaujolais Wine Route. This route reveals the beauty of the region's villages including Oingt, a gem perched on the hillside, Beaujeu, the historic capital of Beaujolais and Fleurie, the ultimate "nature" destination. The soul of the Beaujolais region and its hospitality can be felt at the many events organised in the area, from the International Beaujolais Marathon, to the Sarmentelles in Beaujeu, not forgetting Beaujeu-lez-vous and Rosé Nuits d'été, to name but a few.



Find out more about its history...

2,000 years ago, the Saône and Beaujolais entered the history books, when the Roman legions stormed the Gallic lands.

But the history of Beaujolais really came to life in the Middle Ages. At that time, baronies sprang up all over France, including that of the Sires de Beaujeu, who over the centuries conquered a territory stretching from the south of Burgundy to the north of Lyon, giving rise to the Beaujolais region.

In 1400, the last Lord of Beaujeu left Beaujolais to the Duke of Bourbon. The French revolution abolished the provinces and replaced them with departments. Beaujeu remained the capital of Beaujolais until the 16th century, when it was replaced by the less outlying town of Villefranche-sur-Saône. Thanks to its history, culture and traditions, Beaujolais is now recognised as a unique natural, tourist and wine-growing region.

NATURE ACCESSIBLE TO ALL

The Beaujolais region has a surprisingly wide range of trails - on foot, by bike, mountain bike or horseback, visitors can choose from over 190 walking trails, 12 cycle trails and 20 mountain bike trails. Hike among the vines, lose yourself in the Beaujolais Vert forests, rub shoulders with the peaks or catch a glimpse of the rich built heritage along the way... that's what's on offer if you go hiking in the Beaujolais region.

Beaujolais, UNESCO Global Geopark

In 2018, Beaujolais was the first vineyard in the world to be recognised as a UNESCO Global Geopark.

The combination of its exceptional 500-million-year-old geology and the preservation of this geology make it a remarkable region.

Over 400 km of trails in the Beaujolais region

Criss-crossed by the Pilgrim's Way to Santiago de Compostela, the Way of Assisi and the GR76, the Beaujolais region is a great place for walking. To the north, the 120 km Victor and Estelle trails criss-cross the Crus and Crêtes trails of the Haut Beaujolais. To the south, the 110 km Tour du Beaujolais des Pierres Dorées criss-crosses colourful villages.

AN AREA OF ROLLING HILLS FOR **CYCLING**

The Voie Bleue cycle route which runs along the Saône between Mâcon and Lyon is a highlight in Belleville-en-Beaujolais. From Belleville-en-Beaujolais, cyclists can take the safe Voie Verte track into the Beaujolais region. There are also around twenty cycle trails in the region, covering almost 400 km, with different gradients to suit all abilities. On mountain bikes, the 230 km Grande Traversée du Rhône explores the most beautiful paths in the Beaujolais region.

A closer look at the Voie Verte cycle path

The Voie Verte is a 15 km cycle path through countryside between Belleville and Beaujeu. Its entire length is a safe route and is perfect for a family outing. Cyclists can also make the most of the region's attractions along the way, with views of Mont Brouilly, visits to vineyards and crus, meetings with winegrowers and the chance to sample local produce at the Maison du Terroir Beaujolais.

A GOURMET REGION WITH EXCEPTIONAL WINES

In the Beaujolais region, from north to south, from Burgundy to the Pierres Dorées, more than 2,000 wine estates proudly uphold the values of Beaujolais. Covering 13,500 hectares, the vines produce wines with ageing potential and high-quality appellations.

Beaujolais, 12 appellations and 2 emblematic grape varieties

The vast majority of Beaujolais wines are red (94% of production). Gamay, the essential Beaujolais grape variety, is used to produce red and rosé wines. Chardonnay also flourishes in the Beaujolais limestone soil to produce great white wines. In total, there are 12 appellations, including 10 crus: Saint-Amour, Juliéna, Chénas, Moulin-à-Vent, Fleurie, Chiroubles, Morgon, Régnié, Côte-de-Brouilly and Brouilly.

The Wine Route, 140 km of adventure from north to south

The Beaujolais Wine Route is a great way to explore the vineyards and characterful villages and meet the local people. To guide travellers, 7 tours have been created, each organised around a must-do activity such as a picnic in the vineyards, an aperitif at the top of the Tour d'Oingt or a 'meet the winegrower'.

MEET LOCAL ENTHUSIASTS

Jean-Marc Montegottero, A Beaujolais success story

Founder of Huilerie Beaujolaise in Beaujeu


Jean-Marc tells the story of his early days in the trade at the age of 18, when he discovered an old mill in ruins in the back room of the hardware store his parents had bought. He asked his father to get it up and running again, and found a mentor, Gustave, who agreed to take him under his wing: "I wanted to learn his old techniques from him".

By cultivating this know-how, Jean-Marc always makes sure that the quality of his oils (mainly from nuts: walnuts, almonds, hazelnuts etc.) is up to scratch: "One oil, one nut! It's an approach I've always followed, even when I wasn't earning anything: don't cheat, don't cut corners, don't use additives." He sells his oils directly from the Huilerie Beaujolaise shop, but above all to restaurant owners, and counts many Michelin-starred chefs among his customers.

Jean Marc is also a man of values, and for some years now he has been committed to offering organic products, investing a lot in reforestation and caring for walnut trees: "Man can't only take from the earth; you also have to know how to give. If we could promote techniques that don't rely on chemistry to give back to the soil what has been taken away from it, that would be a great result for me".

Philippe Aufranc, a winegrower who embodies hospitality

Aufranc vineyard in Fleurie

In his wine-tasting cellar, Philippe tells the family story of the vineyard, which began in 1935 with his grandparents Léon and Marie-Antoinette Aufranc.

It was an obvious choice for Philippe to take over the family estate: "At the time, the eldest son took over the vines, so we didn't necessarily ask him what he wanted to do, but I've always liked it." Philippe is keen to make the traditional methods of growing vines and making wine durable, he adds: "Our vineyard is a real heritage, because in one hectare of vines, there are at least five different generations of vines."

This winegrower is a true enthusiast: "I am happy in my vineyards, when they're healthy, I'm happy [...] I'm proud of my job so I want to tell others about it." Equally a proud ambassador for his land, he says: "We have a beautiful region, which isn't isolated, we're just a stone's throw from Paris and Lyon [...] we have gastronomy, scenery and hospitality". Until he retires, Philippe says he will continue to develop the tourist trade on his estate.

REMARKABLE HERITAGE

Between the Pierres Dorées villages, remarkable estates and more niche sites, the Beaujolais region is packed full of architectural gems. Beaujeu, the historic capital, Villefranche-sur-Saône and its Renaissance courtyards and Oingt, a medieval town, are all memorable places for a timeless journey.

THE HILLSIDE PERCHED JEWELS OF THE **PIERRES DORÉES** REGION

Oingt, “Plus Beaux Villages de France”

Once through the fortified gate at Nizy, visitors can wander through the medieval streets, climb to the top of the Donjon tower and admire the golden-coloured historic monuments. Liven up a stroll by meeting passionate artisans.



NEW

“Les Fléaux d’Oingt” - a journey through sound

Visitors can take an audio tour of the village of Oingt, guided by QR codes. This guided tour lets the stones of the village “speak” and tells their story.



Ternand, “Petite Cité de Caractère”

This small village nestling on a rocky headland is a listed historic monument. Visitors can admire the beauty of its houses and discover the remains of the château and its 12th-century keep.



Theizé, a village where the golden stones originated

Theizé is a peaceful village perched on the slopes of Mont Bansillon, overlooking some of the many vineyards in the area. At the top of the village, you can see the old church and the Château de Rochebonne.

TOWNS AND VILLAGES WITH UNIQUE HISTORIES

Villefranche-sur-Saône

This town, gateway to the Beaujolais region, boasts a rich heritage of Italianate Renaissance architecture, which you can discover by following the guided tour, “The Hidden Treasures Trail”.

Maison Vermorel **NEW**

Maison Vermorel, one of Villefranche-sur-Saône’s outstanding heritage sites, is set to open its doors in the summer of 2024 and become a real place to live. This project, supported by the town, has several areas, including a culinary centre with a bistro and a wine cellar, a centre for Villefranche’s economic players and a cultural centre with an artistic programme and cultural education projects.



Clochemerle

The village of “Vaux-en-Beaujolais”, was the inspiration for writer Gabriel Chevallier’s novel “Clochemerle”. This satirical novel, which tells the story of quarrels over the construction of a public urinal was an instant success.



DISCOVER

In the village, a free museum recounts the life of Gabriel Chevallier through his works, sketches and various paper and audiovisual documents. Open all year round.



Beaujeu

Giving its name to the Beaujolais region and appellation, this small town is a historic landmark not to be missed.



NOT TO BE MISSED

The Maison du Terroir Beaujolais is a real showcase for the region, featuring the products of numerous local artisans and producers. Open all year round.

Fleurie

This village, classified as a ‘green’ resort, is the ultimate nature destination and is easily identifiable by the Virgin Mary chapel overlooking the village.



DISCOVER

By taking the Chemin des Lys, visitors can climb up to the Virgin Mary to enjoy the panoramic view over the vineyards of the Fleurie cru and the Saône valley.



CHÂTEAUX TO VISIT

Châteaux en Beaujolais **NEW**

Ten wine châteaux in the Beaujolais region have joined forces to offer a new wine route from the north of Beaujolais to the Pierres Dorées, dedicated to discovering the region's symbolic châteaux such as Château de Poncié, Château des Jacques and Château de la Chaize. Interested visitors can visit their website, then pick up a road map and have it stamped at each château they visit to enjoy a special benefit from the second visit onwards. This could include a free bottle of wine, access to an area usually closed to the public, or a sample of an old vintage, etc.


Château de Jarnioux

This golden stone château dates back to the 13th century and is a Renaissance building. This estate, owned by the Lord of Gléteins, changed hands between families until 1779, when Charlotte, the heir at the time, married Gabriel de Clavière. Their descendants who still own the château, give guided tours. The tour includes an explanation of the château's history, followed by a visit to the gardens, the prison, the chapel and some of the château's rooms.

BEAUJOLAIS, A REGION OF ARTISTS AND ARTISANS

The Beaujolais region has a highly diverse range of arts and crafts to discover. Porcelain, pottery, wrought-iron sculptures, stained glass, jewellery, watercolours, cashmere garments, calligraphy to name just a few. The village of Oingt, in particular, is home to a number of artists. Here's an unexpected meeting with one of them...



Yves Dimier, an inspiring calligrapher

Yves Dimier practices the art of calligraphy in his studio in Oingt. After trying his hand at various visual arts, such as illustration, engraving and photography, calligraphy was a revelation. "I came across a Chinese ideogram with an ink stone, a stick and a paintbrush at a friend's house. It caught my eye and in hindsight, it changed my life", he says.

He points out that this Chinese art is a form of expression "Calligraphy is a 3,000-year-old discipline that is a path of awakening". He says, "We repeat our movement to perfect it, we're looking for pure movement". In fact, he "tries to put drawing into this form of writing" and works from live models. The final work is only the consequence of the intention, as he explains: "We set the intention before setting the shape, the intention precedes and accompanies the movement".

Yves Dimier wants to make the art of calligraphy more accessible, so he organises courses for the general public and meetings with schoolchildren, particularly in Villefranche. "It's important to take the mystery out of calligraphy, to show that it's simple".

UNMISSABLE EXPERIENCES

Vineyard picnics

Winegrowers welcome visitors for a tour of the vineyard and a taste of their wines before setting off into the middle of the vines for a unique gourmet picnic.
